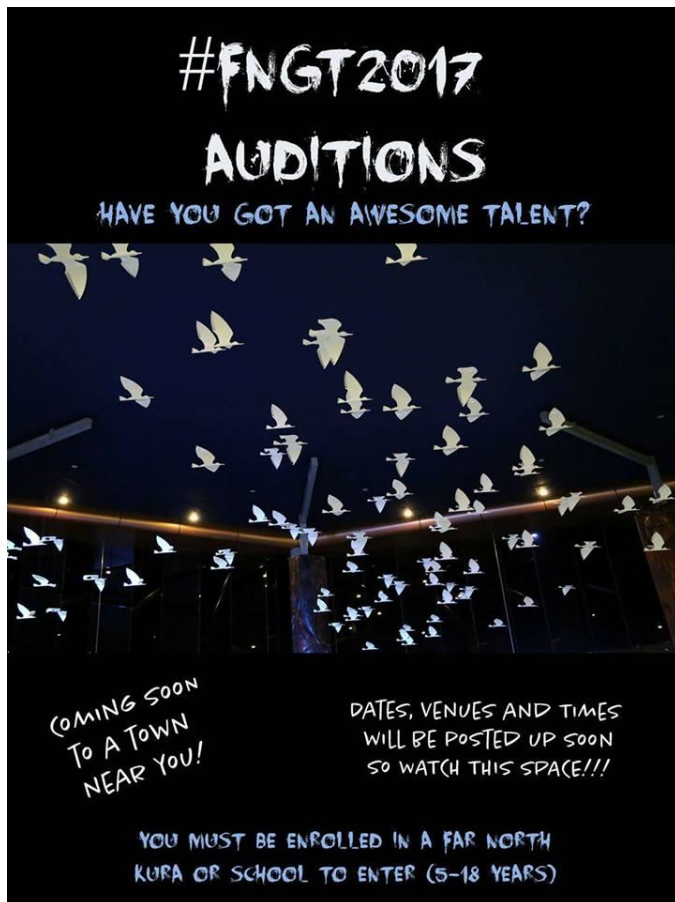

### Skating and Cycles Bylaw 2007

The police have asked us to alert you to the below notices about skateboards, bikes, scooters etc. The local Police force is going to be cracking down on this. This is to give everyone advanced warning.



### ENFORCEMENT

Any user of a skateboard, roller-skates or similar devices, or cycle contrary to clause 2 of this Bylaw shall, at the request or instruction of any enforcement officer, stop and shall upon request, provide their name and address, and any other relevant particulars required by that enforcement officer so as to enable their identity to be confirmed.

An enforcement officer may impound any skateboard, roller-skate or similar device or cycle, at any Council Service Centre or a Police Station, where the owner or rider of that device has previously been personally requested to refrain from riding the device in breach of this Bylaw, and who has been advised of this power to impound the device
