Using respectful language

How do we talk to people?

What is appropriate language for use in class and in the playground?

Show respect:

- I will use polite language in class and in the playground
- I will use an appropriate voice level in the classroom
- I will use polite tone to speak to adults

Act Responsibly:

- I will use a civil (polite) tone
- The voice level I use in the playground may be different to the one I use in class.

- I will not respond to vulgar language by using the same kind of language

Be Safe:

- When disputing a point, I will use a polite (if firm) tone of voice.

* Once students have entered the disco they remain there until a parent comes into the disco to pick them up.


*Students are expected to act Respectfully, Responsibly and Safely at the disco.
