### Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L)

At Kaitaia Intermediate School we develop positive relationships and become successful learners by:

- Staying *safe*
- Showing *respect*, and
- Being *responsible*

### PB4L Focus – Talking to Adults

#### Desired Behaviour

At all times students will:

- Express their needs and wants using polite language, and in a polite tone of voice
- When disputing a point, students will use a polite (if firm) tone of voice
- Inappropriate language used in an aggressive tone of voice or as a put-down will not be tolerated, and a consequence issued.
- Inappropriate language used by mistake e.g. in response to a fright, will be corrected, and alternative vocabulary modelled.
- In class, all students will use an inside voice or as directed by the teacher.

#### Show respect

- I will use polite language in class and in the playground
- I will use an appropriate voice level in the classroom
- I will use polite tone to speak to adults
- I will be kind to others around me

#### Act Responsibly

- I will use a polite tone of voice
- The voice level I use in the playground may be different to the one I use in class
- I will not respond to vulgar language by using the same kind of language

### Be Safe

- When disputing a point, I will use a polite (if firm) tone of voice.
