RHEUMATIC FEVER

Prevention Programme - SORE THROATS MATTER

Rheumatic Fever is a serious disease that can lead to serious heart damage. It usually starts with a sore throat.

Who this affects:

- tamariki/children with a sore throat 4-19 yrs old
- Maori & Pacific Island tamariki 4-19 yrs old are at higher risk
- whanau/family history of rheumatic fever
- whanau/family who share their homes with lots of others
- 3-35 year old household contacts with a sore throat who have been treated for Strep A (GAS Group A Streptococcus)
