Major Prize giving - Tues 8th Dec at 11:30 a.m.

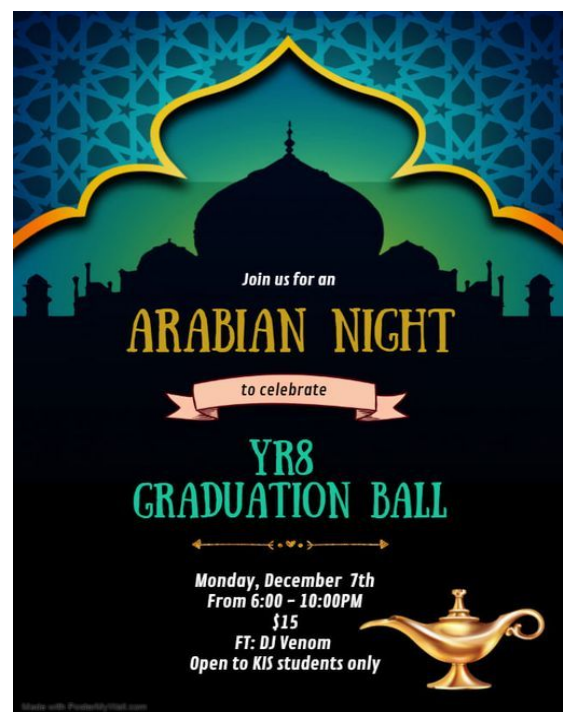
School Ball
